
## Wetskills-Israel 2013



Join the Wetskills Water Challenge in Israel and meet one of the Dutch ministers during their visit to Israel (Nov/Dec 2013)?

The Wetskills organization invites Bachelor, Master, PhD students and fresh graduates to apply for a new Wetskills event in Israel. Apply for this unique opportunity to participate in Wetskills Water Challenge!

#### Wetskills-Israel 2013

The students will work in mixed and multidisciplinary teams of four to develop concepts to the case studies, provided by the water sector during an extensive two-week program at **GWRI**, **Technion-IIT in Haifa**, **Israel** (26th Nov–10th Dec).

The program will start with a team building trip of 2-3 days, in order to get familiar with each other and will be followed by field trips to water-related and cultural sites later. An intensive period will follow, that will combine work on the assigned case study. Dutch and Israeli supervisors will guide you during the week and facilitate your group to find your own solution. Finally, the groups will present their case studies during a central presentation event at the Water event of the *Wittenburg Council* in Israel (8th December). The awarding will be held in the presence of one or more Dutch ministers.

### Who can apply?

Any Bachelor (final stage), Master, PhD students and fresh graduates from Dutch and Master and PhD students from Israeli universities/organizations with passion for water and intercultural teamwork may apply.

## Apply before 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2013

#### **Selection criteria**

Quality of motivation letter, quality of CV, recommendation by your course/program manager or thesis advisor. The Wetskills organization will make a final selection.

#### How can I apply?

Send your motivation letter, CV and recommendation letter to the Wetskills organization.

#### What are the costs?

The costs for the program are 500 euro, including accommodation, some lunches & diners, coffee breaks, field trips, workshops, entrance fees, working locations. Participants are responsible for their own travel expenses (plane tickets, local travel), part of the meals and all other personal costs. The costs for students without accommodation is 250 euro. (Note: The Wetskills organization is striving to find possibilities to keep the costs to the participants at a minimum.)

#### What do I get?

You will increase your skills on: international cooperation, cross-cultural and interdisciplinary team work, networking and presenting (Pitch & Poster). It provides a good opportunity to get contact with other international water students from various universities and water research institutions. You will learn more about the Dutch and Israeli water sectors, their organisations, water industries and collaboration. After completion of the program you will get an certificate of participation.

Next Wetskills Water Challenge will be held in The Netherlands in October/November 2013.
